INTRODUCTION

Join us on this amazing 6 days & 5 nights circuit discovering the gems of Bolivia.

ITINERARY

DAY 1: La Paz / Uyuni

Trip from La Paz going southwest through the highlands in bus to Oruro (3 ½ hours), then train to Uyuni (6-7 hours), crossing a large portion of the highlands. Overnight in hotel.



DAY 2: Full day Uyuni Salt Flats

Trip to Colchani, to see locals producing salt, enter this natural wonder of nature with over 10,000 km2, crossing to "Isla Incahuasi" (2 hours), a special habitat of volcanic rock and giant cactus. Then north to see the mummies of Coquesa in the foothills of the Tunupa volcano. Return to Uyuni (2 hours), overnight in hotel.





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
DAY 3: Uyuni / Potosi City Tour

Bus trip crossing branches of the Andes Range with great landscapes, old mines and Indian villages to Potosi (4 hours). In the afternoon visit of the colonial city, seeing the Mint House, colonial churches and the local market.



DAY 4: Cerro Rico Mines / Sucre

Visit a mine to see remains of the silver production in the famous Silver Mountain. Afternoon bus to Sucre (3 hours), nice colonial city, set in the lower valleys.



DAY 5: Sucre City Tour

Half day city tour, visiting the cathedral and church of la Recoleta and its museums, the cemetery, and the Indian Textile museum of ASUR. Pm at leisure.



DAY 6: Sucre / La Paz

You will be collected from your hotel at the appropriate time and transferred to the airport for your onward flight.


